Counter Space is pleased to present a solo exhibition by artist Jos Näpflin (b. 1950) consisting of new installations, as well as graphic, video and audio works.

In the past months Näpflin has been taking an in-depth look at Robert Walser. Time as one of the constants in Walser's work appears in the transformation of Walser's 1914 short story The Dramer wherein the artist has interchanged seasons, turning the setting from summer into winter. A lad, dreaming in the grass, becomes a solitary wanderer, who one icy morning, frozen, no longer wakes up.

The daily walks taken by Walser in and around Herisau, in the canton of Appenzell Ausserrhoden in Switzerland, were a staple activity in life of Walser, having walked for a period of more than twenty years. The iconic last photograph of him shows him toppled in the snow. The locality and its situational elements became materials for Report (R.W.) (2016) and also for The Last Walk (Footpoints) (2015).

Näpflin preferably moves at a distance from what is happening, changing his position. This he shows in $\mathcal{R}_{\text{CPOT}}$ ($\mathcal{R}.W.$), with various analyses on the terrain where Walser was found, with both a topographic map and an aerial photograph. The transformed short story re-appears, as well as a photograph with Walser's suited torso bespeckled with snow.

Several identical columns are reproduced in the installation FROS (2016), an existing element of the exhibition site, a mimickry of the architectural space, and complemented by the peculiar coolness of water, possibly insinuating the remnants of melted snow.

On a specially crafted table lies the multiple NACHIEN, comprised of a dividing branch. All the recent works by Jos Näpflin bear a duality: day-night as the most obvious, the change of from solid to liquid, the directions of East-West, or Walser's last steps, standing-lying. These dual elements appear seamlessly throughout the exhibition. Already when entering the gallery space of Counter Space visitors have to decide: either left or right, life or death.
